### BAA AWARDS FIVE \$2,000 SCHOLARSHIPS IN 2008!

2008 marks the fifth year in which we have awarded scholarships to deserving students. Thanks to donor generosity, especially the classes of 1967 & 1957, five \$2000 scholarships were awarded on May 13th at Brentwood High School. A total of 24 applications were received, thoroughly reviewed, and discussed by the BAA Scholarship Committee.

**Jeffrey Britton:** Curiosity about "how things work" has led Jeff to a desire to study Chemical or Ceramic Engineering. ### RESTAURANTS AND CONFECTIONARY STORES KNOWN BY STUDENTS AROUND BRENTWOOD OVER THE YEARS

Do you remember some of these places? The Village Inn near Bremerton and Litzsinger, Foot Long Hotdog (now Carl's), much loved Velvet Freeze on Brentwood across from the now City Hall parking lot; Frosty Manor on Brentwood near Madge; The Hitching Post on Manchester.....Cottage Inn across from Posch's Drug Store; Posch's had a great fountain in the 40's; Hounsom's Drug Store on Manchester and Kleisly's at Bridgeport and Brentwood Blvd. had nice fountains, too. And in the vicinity of Eager Road, how about Belvedere Joe's? Class of 1941 had a 5th reunion there (Norma Hodges Murphy '41 reports that many, including her stepfather and the then mayor of Brentwood, hung out there).... the Trio Restaurant. Van Horn's on Litzsinger (remember the beautiful carpeted stairway?), where Mount Calvary Lutheran Church now is located. And then there was Caruso's with its great pizzas, students worked there part time (even Elvis Presley and his entourage stopped there one night); the Chili House across Manchester from Caruso's and Buckingham's Chicken on Manchester. Another was Hy's Drive In, which reportedly had the best cheeseburgers. It was owned by the father of Judy Heynen Robinson '59.

There was a great little confectionary on Brentwood across from the City Hall, where Brentwood No. 1 students visited frequently. It had several steps up to the front door. (Does anyone remember the name?) There was a Bick's Confectionary somewhere, too. Then there were places in Rock Hill and Richmond Heights, visited by BHS students all the time.....Nahm's Nook, Blase's (hamburgers with slaw was their specialty), two Steak 'n Shakes (on Brentwood Blvd. and on Manchester), and Redwood near Steak 'n Shake on Brentwood.

## HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES CONTRIBUTE IN VARIOUS WAYS

The second group of Brentwood High School Hall of Fame inductees represent a variety of ways in which graduates have contributed to society after leaving BHS. The group of 14 will be inducted during the annual "3rd Weekend in September" celebration this fall. The actual ceremony is scheduled for 7 p.m. on Friday, September 19th, in the high school auditorium. The HOF committee and BAA Board of Directors agonized over a list of over 40 highly qualified nominees to come up with the final "Class of 08." We're sure that many nominees, who weren't selected, will be considered for the next induction in 2010. Meanwhile, here is a brief look at your Brentwood High School Hall of Famers for 2008:



**MOIR BROWN STEVENS** (*Class of 1947*)--Class valedictorian, Moir earned a full ride scholarship to Washington University and then founded three businesses with her husband, John Stevens. Since his death in 2005, Moir has continued to run projects, including the restoration of the Ozark Theatre in Webster Groves and other historic buildings.



**LINDA E. DOLLAR** (*Class of 1966*)--An excellent athlete at Brentwood, Linda took her skills and knowledge into the college ranks. She coached volleyball at Southwest Missouri State University (now Missouri State) for 24 seasons, leading her teams to a 758-266-21 record. She was the first women's college volleyball coach to reach 700 career victories and was 3 times Coach-of-the-Year. Besides serving as Assistant Athletic Director, she also was Field of Play supervisor at the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta.



**DENNIS G. KURRE** (*Class of 1958*)--Using his leadership skills and toughness learned on the BHS football team, Dennis joined the Marine Corps, achieving the rank of 2nd Lieutenant, and then joined the FBI. He worked his way up through the ranks from special agent all the way to Deputy Assistant to the Director and Acting Assistant Director. He retired in 1997, but has stayed active with Keyware Solutions in Virginia.



**JAMES R. LITZSINGER** (*Class of 1957*)--Jim took his Brentwood learning experience to the Hoosier State where he has been a leader in the corporate and charity communities. Employed by Eli Lilly and Company for over 35 years, he worked in 13 different divisions, and was Manager of Industrial Engineering. Jim has also been active in the United Way campaigns, Planning Commission for Carmel, and a statewide appointed committee working on jury reform.

**RICHARD C. (SKIP) MANGE** (*Class of 1958*)--After graduating from Brentwood and Washington University, Skip served for 4 years in the US Army Corps of Engineers as a 2nd Lieutenant. After a successful career in the construction and residential development industry, he “retired” to become a high school math and science teacher. He “retired” again and became involved in civic affairs. After serving as Mayor of Town and Country for two terms, he was elected to the St. Louis County Council until finally really retiring.



**KENNETH R. MARION** (*Class of 1962*)--Ken loved Biology at BHS and that led him to a career in Biology and Environmental Sciences. After earning his Ph.D. from Washington University, Ken decided to stay in college...and has been on the faculty of the University of Alabama-Birmingham ever since. He has been Chairman of the Biology Department since 2000. His concerns for the environment have led him to serve on the boards of many groups and to conduct workshops and consortiums around the country.



**ROBERT H. NIEMEIER** (*Class of 1959*)--Bob has turned his love of his hometown into a lifelong journey. After serving in the Army Reserves and briefly as a Brentwood police officer, he found his home in the Brentwood Fire Department. He has served on many Missouri Bar Committees and in 2006, Roy achieved the high honor of an appointment to the Missouri Court of Appeals for the Eastern District.

He came back to become a lawyer and public officeholder in his hometown. He soon jumped into the political arena, being elected the youngest police judge in Missouri. He also served as Brentwood Mayor for 13 years. Ed authored several books on law and municipal government and was active in the St. Louis civil rights movement.



**STEVEN H. YORK** (*Class of 1961*)--Steve was a fan of the arts at BHS, Washington University, and the University of Denver. The result has been an honored career in video documentaries. Steve has served in the roles of producer, director, writer, photographer, and narrator in a long list of documentaries which have earned awards and recognition in many festivals. She loves to walk the trails to see all types of wildlife in their natural habitat.

In early 2008, Barry made Queen Elizabeth II's New Year's Honours List, in recognition of his contribution to commerce and industry. ## TEACHERS' CORNER



*Editor's Note: The following is a condensation of the profile that appeared in the October 2007 issue of THE EAGLE'S NEST, the newsletter written by Barbara Bond Simon for the Brentwood High Class of 1959.*

### Coach Bill Long

When Bill Long came to teach and coach at Brentwood High in 1953, this 27-year-old with the North Carolina drawl already had led a full life. And after retiring, he had a couple of more careers, albeit less lengthy ones.

"Coach," as students and faculty alike called him for decades, had been a Depression Era orphan. He went into the Navy out of high school in 1942 and served on the submarine USS Swordfish in the Pacific Theater. There, Lt. Long led a team of frogmen who worked under water clearing detonators out of mines and disassembling nets being used by the Japanese to ensnare Allied troop ships. Bill was on Iwo Jima before the invasion actually began. His mission was to find and map the locations of the Japanese munitions dumps. During one spying mission,

he encountered an enemy soldier. His ability at wrestling is the reason Bill won that battle and was able to save his own life. He was on the battleship USS Missouri when the atomic bombs were dropped on Japan, ending the war. Afterwards, Adm. William (Bull) Halsey personally pinned a medal on his chest.

One of Bill's war adventures was movie-plot stuff. He had been rescued from a raft in enemy waters by a swift boat commander. That man came to St. Louis in 1960 as presidential candidate John F. Kennedy. When JFK saw Coach in the crowd on his campaign stop, he asked if they had met previously. "Yes, sir, we have," Long replied in his North Carolina drawl. Kennedy then remembered. "I went flying through there, trying to pick you up," he said of bringing Coach into that now-famous PT-109.

Long, after getting his bachelor's from Appalachian State, and his MBA from Washington University, came to Brentwood to teach eighth grade combination and to coach freshman football, basketball and track.

Oh, and he somehow found Anne Gordon at a Sunday night church service. They were married Christmas Day 1954 and spent 52 years together. Anne died two years ago. "I don't have the words to describe how beautiful my wife was.

I had learned a lot about life in the orphanage, but my wife taught me how to live in a home. We raised three children, and we did it together." After retiring, Bill worked for nine years as a member of the Football Cardinals' equipment staff. He could be found at each home game as a member of the "chain gang."
