HALL OF FAME COMMITTEE WORKING TO SELECT 2ND CLASS OF INDUCTEES - 2008

"They may be the second class to go into the Hall, but we think that they'll be first-class selections." So said BAA Hall of Fame Committee Chairperson Ed Wright, Jr. at a recent BAA board meeting.

The committee is finalizing its goals and selection criteria and process with hopes of announcing the newest honorees in the next newsletter or sooner. "We've been looking at how other high schools in the area are doing this and reviewing how our initial selection process worked. We hope to come up with something that's fair and objective...but still leave that Brentwood flavor to it," Wright said.

While 14 members were inducted in the September, 2006, ceremony, the committee is hoping to choose 5-10 honorees from over 25 names already submitted. The achievements of the nominees range from the athletic field to the business world, from music to politics, from education to medicine. "We have so many great graduates from BHS to choose from. We know we may not make everyone happy, but we'll do our best."

The Hall of Fame will be inducting new members in September, 2008, and then skipping a year as the BAA's 3rd Weekend in September plans a football game for 2009. Sara, in 1977. In 1984 they moved from Webster Groves to Union, MO, where they acquired a small business. Pat retired from TWA in 1989 and kept busy in the business and their house on 80 acres, where they enjoyed the outdoors, including riding their horses and fishing.

Nowadays, Pat is busier than ever dividing her time between babysitting her one year old grandson, Brayden, and volunteering at her local animal shelter. About four years ago, Pat and Ron went to the Franklin County Humane Society to adopt a new family friend; not only did they get their Australian Shepherd, Casey, that day, but they also found a new passion. Both began volunteering a few hours a week, which eventually became many, many volunteer hours for the shelter.

Once a month, Pat, Ron, and Sara, plus other volunteers, work adoptions at Petsmart in Sunset Hills.

They take 10 to 15 dogs from Union in hopes of finding good homes for them. Pat has also organized the shelter's most successful fundraisers to date, raising almost \$35,000 in two years. In her hands-on work at the shelter, Pat often bathes and walks dogs. She says "The dogs are just so grateful to have someone show they care." Pat and Ron also serve as foster parents for pets until they can be adopted to a new loving home. Although some days she would tell you it is emotionally challenging to volunteer at the shelter, the reward is watching the families when they find their new best friend, and the cat or dog gets a second chance at life.
