Brentwood Boulevard used to be a farm road, from Brentwood northwards, with a very steep hill going down to what is now Brentwood Square. It had a sharp turn to the right and then a sharp left to connect to now Brentwood Blvd. at the bottom of the hill. There had been several accidents along this stretch--wagons missing the turns and running off the road and some

Thad Falkner '86




Thad Falkner
