BHS "UNDER CONSTRUCTION" BUT 3RD WEEKEND REUNION

IS STILL ON!

As you may recall, Brentwood voters passed a Prop B measure which will result in many improvements to the Middle and High School campuses, including new safety features, new science labs, new commons/library space, and more. Construction began on June 1 and is moving full steam ahead. While this is exciting news for the school district and community, it will have an impact on our traditional *3rd Weekend* Friday afternoon and evening activities. The courtyard is not available for use this year, and so the Alumni Board has worked closely with Superintendent Dr. Brian Lane on an alternative location, but keeping it at the school. The main activities, starting at 4 pm on Friday September 20th,

will be on the track at the north end of the football field. (In case you forgot your directions from Mr. Brown's Geography class, this is the area by Moritz Avenue.) Registration, decade tables, sales of alumni items, and other typical reunion activities will take place in this area from 4-7 pm.

The construction has restricted some parking at the front of the school, but we anticipate plenty of parking on White Avenue, Moritz Avenue, other side streets, and even McGrath Elementary School, which is only a block from the high school. You will be able to enter the track from White Avenue, the Middle School, the front of the high school, or Moritz Avenue. Handicap access should be available from Moritz Avenue and the

front of the high school.

We think you will be excited to see what's happening at your old school and hope to have tours of the school, including a look at the work-in-progress, which will be led by District personnel. You may even get a hard hat to wear. Don't forget that the Eagles football team will be playing Orchard Farm that evening at 7 pm and you're invited to stay and watch and visit the Eagles Nest Concession Stand before you move on to other watering holes in the area. Don't let a little dust and gravel stop you from coming back to good old BHS this September. We'll see you on the track!

Thanks to these former Eagles football players for the following memories written by Rick Wuestling, Bill Jackson and Zach Cartwright, after 50 years ago of the MOST MEMORABLE FOOTBALL GAME – 1969

ONE-POINT WONDERS

This year we celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Moon Landing, Woodstock and one of the most memorable football games in BHS history – The Clayton Game. It is considered to be the greatest comeback in the history of St. Louis area football, in that the Eagles, being down 29 to 0 at the end of the third quarter, scored thirty points in the fourth quarter to win the game, 30 – 29. Many long-time residents of Brentwood still remember the roars coming from BHS' field that evening.

In the Sixties the Eagles were one of the most successful football programs in Missouri. Led by legendary Coach **John Titus**, the Eagles were perennial conference champions. In 1967, the Eagles were crowned small school state champions. That team was led by Two-Time Parade Magazine High School All-Americans **Chuck Roper '68** (quarterback) and **Kurt Gebhard '68** (tackle). Roper and Gebhard led the Eagles to three consecutive undefeated seasons. The 1969 Eagles' senior class went into that season determined to win every game on their schedule and live up to their predecessors' record.

The 1969 seniors were talented scholar athletes. Five of them played football in college with one of them participating in two training camps with the Oakland Raiders. More importantly they were fine students. Two became surgeons. Two became lawyers. One became head buyer for a very large department store chain. One became a Ph. D. and renowned scientist. Others were very successful in business. Several of them were National Merit Scholars.

The 1969 season found the Eagles in a conference with Clayton, Maplewood, Affton, Berkley and Lafayette. Clayton was considered our biggest rival, though we had dominated the rivalry in football. But, the Eagles were the biggest game on each of our opponent's schedules. And, each week the Eagles got the others team's best.

The season started well with dominating wins over Principia and St. Charles. The next game, against Lafayette on their field in sweltering heat, was arguably the toughest game of the season. Lafayette had a very talented team. It was a slugfest, but the Eagles' undefeated season was preserved when co-captain and halfback **Scott Neunuebel '70** ran a kickoff back ninety yards for a touchdown. The Eagles prevailed with a comeback 21-20 win and so began the start of their eventual nickname, i.e. **The One Point Wonders**. Unfortunately, in practice the next week, the Eagles lost Neunuebel for the season when he tore ligaments in his knee. Despite injuries to other key players, the Eagles won their next five games, including one point comeback wins over Maplewood and Affton

In their final game of the season the Eagles were scheduled to play the Greyhounds on November 14, 1969. Missouri had implemented a playoff system the year before, where four teams from each class were selected to play for a state championship based on a complicated point system. Although BHS was undefeated going into its game with Clayton, the team already knew that it could not qualify for the playoffs. A perfect season and another undisputed conference championship were the only things on the line.

Coached by the great John Titus, the Eagles took the home field on that

cold Friday night, just a bit overconfident and looking forward to the victory party. But Clayton had some pretty good athletes, too, plus a lot of motivation. The Greyhounds dominated for three quarters! Near the end of the 3rd quarter, Clayton led 29-0 and had the ball first and goal inside the BHS 5-yard line, ready to score again. We had not stopped them much the whole game, but managed to do so on 4th and goal from the one.

Taking over on their own one yard line, the Eagles began to show life and move the ball. Fullback **Bob Brunk '70** gave the Eagles hope when he took off up the middle for a forty yard gain, culminating in him driving his tackler violently into the ground. From there the Eagles employed a number of run and pass plays to move the ball to the Greyhound one yard line as the third quarter ended. On the first play of the fourth quarter Brunk scored on a run over left guard. A 2-point conversion by Brunk made it 29-8. At least we weren't going to get shut out.

Then things finally started to turn the Eagles' way. After returning the kickoff, Clayton fumbled on its first play from scrimmage. The fumble was caused when tackle **Bill Jackson '70** and linebacker **Scott Savage '71** met the ball carrier behind the line and disconnected the ball from the runner. BHS quickly scored again on a 3-play drive, with Brunk taking it in on a draw play. His hole was opened wide by an offensive line consisting of Jackson (at center on offense), guards Scott Savage and **Bob Bolling**, and tackles **Zach Cartwright '70** and **Wes Perkins '70**. We ran the same play for another 2-point conversion. 29-16, with about 9 minutes left in the game.

On Clayton's next possession, safety **Rick Wuestling '70** intercepted a hurried sideline pass, the result of a strong pass rush by Cartwright. Using Coach Titus' imaginative play calling that employed pass plays to the sidelines to stop the clock, we moved the ball down the field and scored on a pass from quarterback Wuestling to end **James McNair '70**. The drive also featured completions to ends **Bill Buckner '70** and **Victor Ruiz '70**. Yet another 2-point run by Brunk, and the game was suddenly 29-24 with about 5 minutes to play.

Brentwood tried an onside kick, which failed. Now, the Greyhounds had the ball in the Eagles territory with a chance to put the game away, but couldn't do it. Three Greyhound running plays set up a 4th and short, and Clayton elected to go for it. Sophomore defensive tackle **Mike Conley '72** and seniors Buckner, Brunk and Wuestling combined to make the stop of the game – nailing the Clayton running back for no gain. As a result the Greyhounds turned the ball over on downs.

At that point, everybody in a BHS jersey and the fans who had kept the faith knew what was going to happen. Several completed passes and two runs out-of-bounds moved the ball into scoring position. Wuestling then took it to the one on a keeper off left guard. Timeout. And then Brunk (who else?) slammed into the middle on a draw play that fooled no one, and fought his way across the goal line for the final touchdown. Brentwood 30 – Clayton still 29. It was improbable, almost impossible, but the **One-Point Wonders** had done it again!

Rick Wuestling will be hosting the seniors from the 1969 Eagles' team at a reunion on November 9, 2019. Fallen teammates Scott Neunuebel and Bill Buckner will be remembered.
