BAA AWARDS 2012 SCHOLARSHIPS TO SENIORS – TOTAL \$21,000

Since 2003, the Brentwood Alumni Association has awarded \$79,000 to students, based on exceptional academic achievement, extracurricular participation, citizenship, community service, and financial aid needs. Through the generosity of alumni and charitable giving partners, BAA has been able to increase its scholarship funding every year. This year's six recipients each received a scholarship of \$3,500, presented at the May 3rd Senior Awards ceremony at BHS. These graduates stressed how important and rewarding it was to "give back" to the community and how their hard work and leadership possibilities helped make this possible. All are eager to meet the future challenge of advanced education. This year's recipients were:

PAIGE ANDERSON



Paige has a motto, as told to her by her mother: "Leave the world a better place than you found it." She secured an admirable 4.06 GPA and an ACT/SAT score of 25 at BHS. While serving on the Debate Team, through practice, recruiting, and coaching first year debaters, she helped the Team to become one of BHS's top debate teams in our district. In addition to working part time, Paige was a Vacation Bible School Group Leader; she made a mission trip to Canada to teach native children. Paige performed a total of 22 hours of community service for the National Honor Society the last two years and volunteered for two weeks at HandyCamp, a camp helping physically and/or mentally disabled adults for a week. She was selected for a 2011 session of Missouri Girls' State. Paige began reinvesting in BHS through her leadership in Girlz Club, whose goal is to teach girls with developmental disabilities about social skills through crafts and fun outings. By serving as a past President of the Brentwood National Honor Society, she has guided planning of charitable events. "Giving back" in this endeavor has been extremely rewarding to Paige. She plans to attend the University of Missouri-Columbia, with a major in Business.

SEAN KOSTER



Sean stated that he was deserving of this scholarship not only because of his academic abilities, but, also because of his unique leadership skills and passion to give back to others. Sean posted an excellent 4.25 GPA with an ACT/SAT score of 31. As a sophomore, he was the youngest student in the Student Council and only sophomore to hold this position. He became the youngest president, in school history, of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes at BHS. A lead guitar player for the Jazz Band, he received the Louis Armstrong Jazz Award, first time ever for BHS, given to only one student at each school. He has served as president or captain of four different organizations, Student Council, Fellowship of Christian Athletes, Captain of the Purple People, and Founder and President of Dubers United, which Sean founded with the intention of, with a few students, weekly analyzing techniques and algorithms to solve the Rubik's Cube. This was rewarding to him because younger students found acceptance, acquired a sense of belonging, and learned much in the process. By his leadership, Sean hopes he made a positive impact on BHS and is gratified that he was able to help a student with depression, pray with someone about their problems, and offer a smile and hug to anyone who needed it on a bad day. He has worked part time as a team member in fast food and was recognized as an Outstanding Leader of St. Louis by County Executive Charles Dooley in 2011. He plans to attend the University of Oklahoma in the Physics program.

AMY LEE



Amy says that she is determined to expel "monotony" from her life. She achieved an outstanding GPA record of 4.15 and ACT/SAT score of 32, while trying nearly any kind of extracurricular activity BHS offered. Knowing that compromise was necessary, as she couldn't do all at once, she learned her true passions, and her love of learning remained constant. She attended Missouri Scholars Academy, a three week program at the University of Missouri-Columbia for the state's top 300 students. Choosing an academic major of Education Renovation and a minor in Pop Culture Anthropology, Amy participated in both conventional and unconventional learning activities. This was incredibly refreshing to her, in an environment with other students passionate about their education. Amy took college credit courses in her last two years in French IV and V, English III, Calculus I, Human Anatomy, and Western Civilization. In these difficult courses, she maintained a 3.98 GPA. He was given a National Merit Commendation for past PSAT scores and has dedicated himself to extracurricular activities. Christopher has been in Brentwood Winter Drumline, played junior varsity baseball, appeared in four theatre productions, and competed on the Debate Team. He was ranked within the top 25 competitors in debate in the district and competed at national level tournaments. Christopher was named the 2011 MSHAA state champion in radio speaking. 

Congregational Church....Brentwood Bowling Alley.... Friday night pizza at Caruso's...burgers at McDonald's and Carl's and Hy's Drive-In on Manchester... Steak 'n Shake and Redwood on the "Miracle Mile" (Brentwood Blvd.).

Lowell Turner '47 reported that during World War II, students of Brentwood Schools, including Boy Scouts, collected aluminum pots, pans, etc. depositing them in a pile about 100 feet in diameter by 10 feet high. (Doesn't this relate to today?) Flat trailer beds had to be pushed by hand. During this time, the quarry on the south side of Manchester just east of Brentwood Blvd. was half full of water.

Bill Walters'59 wrote in and said about the Highlands Amusement Park and the Admiral, both long gone. "I can still smell the ground cover they used at the Highlands; it had a unique smell, don't know what it was. My family always had a yearly summer outing on the Admiral. Do you remember those coin machines that dispensed pictures of movie stars, etc.? I remember they had a juke box that had a little band on the top. When you put the coin in for the song, the curtain would open and the individuals in the band would move. My favorite song on that juke box was Sh Boom by the Crew Cuts."

ACROSS THE DECADES..... A TRIP DOWN MEMORY LANE AGAIN!

Do you remember that lovely pond/lake that lies between the 2500 blocks of Salem Road and Cecelia Avenue in eastern Brentwood? It is still there, perched in a sinkhole on top of a hill. It was a place for kids to fish, swim, skate, and simply admire it's beauty, since that lake was so unique to Brentwood. The lake was called Lake Bompert, named for Louis Bompert, who from the city of St. Louis went west and purchased 1100 acres of virgin timberland in what is now Brentwood. Later, it was called Lake Wartenbe, named after caretakers who lived there beginning around 1914. The editor goes by the lake often, from her son's house on White Avenue, slows down and views it on her way down Cecelia Avenue to Manchester.

Legend has it that some pigs during a drought, rooting in a low spot for water, opened up a spring which flooded the space. There apparently was (or is) an underground river flowing beneath Brentwood and many springs and sinkholes in the entire area. The lake is about an acre in size.

It was reported that the Missouri Conservation Department, interested in the unique type of moss in the lake, seined and drained it around the late 50's; they found a monster catfish. Again, according to legend, someone emptied their moss laden goldfish bowl into the lake, resulting in unusual growth of moss and goldfish in the lake.

There is a very interesting article about Lake Bompert (it was later renamed to its original name) on our website www.brentwoodhsalumni.org written by **Nelson S. Morgan '66**, who lived in the neighborhood. If you get a chance to visit Brentwood, go by and view this lake, which is just north of Manchester.

HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES SET HIGH STANDARDS

The fourth group of Brentwood High School Hall of Fame inductees includes seven graduates who have achieved high levels of success in their chosen fields and in their contributions to their communities.

This "BHS Hall of Fame Class of 2012" will be officially inducted in a ceremony scheduled for 7:00 p.m. on Friday, September 14, 2012, in the high school auditorium. The Hall of Fame Committee has worked diligently to research and identify the candidates, which it felt met criteria for Hall of Fame. There is a strong field of nominees for 2014, and it is the pleasure of the HOF Committee and the Brentwood Alumni Association Board of Directors to introduce you to the 2012 inductees:



Edwin Dugger - Class of 1958

Ed was an influential presence on the Bay Area's music scene since the late sixties. From 1960 to 1961, he studied in Salzburg, Austria before returning to complete his undergraduate degree at Oberlin College Conservatory of Music in Ohio, where he joined the faculty in 1967. Then he began his thirty-five year career at the University of California, Berkeley, where he taught Music Composition and Analysis. In 1969, he proposed the formation of the Berkeley Contemporary Chamber Players, a group of undergraduate and graduate students and professional players. During the first season there, he conducted, stage directed and acted in a number of programs. In subsequent seasons, Ed conducted many works and coached performances. He also founded and directed the Music Department's first electronic music studio. Equally at home in the electronic and acoustic media, Ed has produced works for varied ensembles. Later, rekindling his love of theatre, Ed composed three works for modern dance for large orchestra, computer produced sounds, and chamber orchestra. He then produced works featuring electronically-produced sounds combined with live instruments and composed three works for modern dance, plus twenty-

seven other extensive works for instruments. His honors and awards include a Guggenheim Fellowship, a Naumberg award, and an award from the American Academy of Arts and Letters. He has received commissions from the Boston Symphony and Fromm Foundation, Columbia University, the Koussevitzky Foundation in the Library of Congress, and many others. Ed resides in Virginia, is married to Kathryn, and has one son.

Gary G. Grindler - Class of 1968

Gary is now serving as Chief of Staff and Counselor to the U.S. Attorney General. He practiced law for over thirty-five years, but wanted to devote a significant part of his career to public service. In 1982 he became Assistant U.S. Attorney in the Southern District of New York and later transferred to the Atlanta U.S. Attorney's Office. Gary represented the Secret Service in the Kenneth Starr investigation and represented the President in the Whitewater investigation. In 1995, after leaving a small law firm he had started, Gary joined the Department of Justice in Washington, D.C. as a Deputy Assistant Attorney General in the Civil Division. After joining a private law firm in Washington, D.C., he returned to the Department of Justice in 2009. As Acting Deputy Attorney General, Gary was chief operating officer for the Department with supervisory responsibility for more than one hundred fifteen employees, all U.S. Attorney's Offices and main Justice components, including the Civil, Tax, Criminal, National Security, Civil Rights, Antitrust and Environmental Divisions, the FBI, DEA, ATF, U.S. Marshal's Service, Bureau of Prisons and Department administrative offices. Gary has actively participated in the American Bar Association, and was included in the 2006 to 2009 editions of the Best Lawyers of America before returning to government service. Gary received both his undergraduate and law degrees from Northwestern University, where he served as Special Projects Editor of the Journal of Criminal Law and Criminology. He has written and co-authored many publications. Gary has been involved in the community, doing much pro bono work with indigents, death penalty habeas corpus matters, mentoring young lawyers, and supporting Lift Me Up and Newcomers, an organization which supports a battered women's center. Gary resides in Virginia with his wife, Christine; they have four sons and one grandchild.



Nancy Jo Olson Hacker - Class of 1969

Nancy is the Deputy Director, Financial Management, and Comptroller for the U.S. Air Force Space Command at Peterson Air Force Base, Colorado. The major command headquarters is responsible for annual research and development, acquisition, and operations and maintenance funding exceeding \$11 billion, plus space and cyber facilities across the world, wherever the U.S. Air Force operates. She was the first civilian to attain this post. Having received promotions through the years, she is now a civilian GS-15, the highest rank in the general schedule system. Nancy began her civilian career with the U.S. Air Force in 1982 as a clerk typist in the Flight Records Office at Sheppard Air Force Base, Texas. She also received the West County YMCA Community Service Award in 1986. Appointed to serve on the Committee on Quality Education under U.S. District Judge Limbaugh, Linda helped monitor the

quality of education in non-integrated schools in St. Louis. She was elected to the Executive Committee for 1986 to 1989. From 1999 until her retirement in 2010, Linda served as Professor and Department Chair of Teacher Education at St. Louis Community College, Florissant Valley. She taught as an adjunct professor at Fontbonne University 2010-2011. Linda earned a B.S. in Elementary Education from the University of Missouri, Columbia, a M.A. in Early Childhood Special Education from Washington University, and a Ph.D. in Educational Leadership from St. Louis University. Currently, Linda is enjoying retirement in St. Louis with her husband, Ron, and son, David.

Karl E. Heger, Class of 1981



Active in track and field at BHS, Karl was 1981 State Champion in Pole Vault. In 1980 he competed in World Trampoline Championships in Brig, Switzerland, placing 6th. He went on to compete in eleven World Trampoline Championships from 1980 to 1999. He won two Team Gold, two Team Silver, and one Team Bronze medals. At the same time, he was ranked in the top ten in double mini trampoline and set three world records. Karl was named Trampoline Athlete of the Year three times and inducted into the USA Gymnastic Hall of Fame as an individual in 2007 and inducted in 2009 as a member of the 1999 World Champion Double Mini Trampoline Team. Karl attended the University of Missouri, Columbia and Northern Illinois University, both on ROTC scholarships. He received many letter awards and recognition in swimming, diving, and springboard. At Northern Illinois he was Outstanding Scholar Athlete of the Year in 1986. From 1987 to 1993 Karl served as a Lieutenant and a Captain in the US Army Air Defense Artillery. He was the 1987 Distinguished Graduate of Air Defense Officer Basic School. Karl, in 1992, was awarded a Bronze Star for his platoon's performance during Operation Desert Storm, capturing two enemy armored personnel carriers and one hundred ten enemy soldiers. An honor graduate of Johnson County Police Academy, Karl, as FBI Special Agent, served as a police officer for Prairie Village and Overland Park, Kansas. From 1994 to 2001 Karl, as FBI Special Agent, worked countering drugs and gangs in Rockford, Illinois. Presently, Karl is Assistant SWAT Team Leader for Chicago FBI SWAT Team and tactical firearms trainer for Chicago's four-hundred-fifty FBI agents and fifty man SWAT team. In 2006, he helped plan and participated in a successful hostage rescue of an eighteen- year old and in 2010 was one of the assistant SWAT team leaders of Operation Guard Shack, one of the largest FBI SWAT operations which arrested one-hundred-thirty corrupt police officers in Puerto Rico. Karl resides in Illinois and has two sons, who participated in national trampoline champion competitions just like their father.

Jimmy attended Drury College majoring in Fine Arts. 

In addition to her work as a Public Defender, Bevy teaches Trial Advocacy at Washington University and St. Louis University Law Schools. In 2010, she was elected by the lawyers in the City of St. Louis to serve on the Missouri Bar Board of Governors. She also serves on the Board of Directors for Join Hands, ESL, a group dedicated to improving educational opportunities for children in East St. Louis. She is convinced that education can help to break the cycle of poverty and crime.




SANDY KURRE LAGARCE '61


