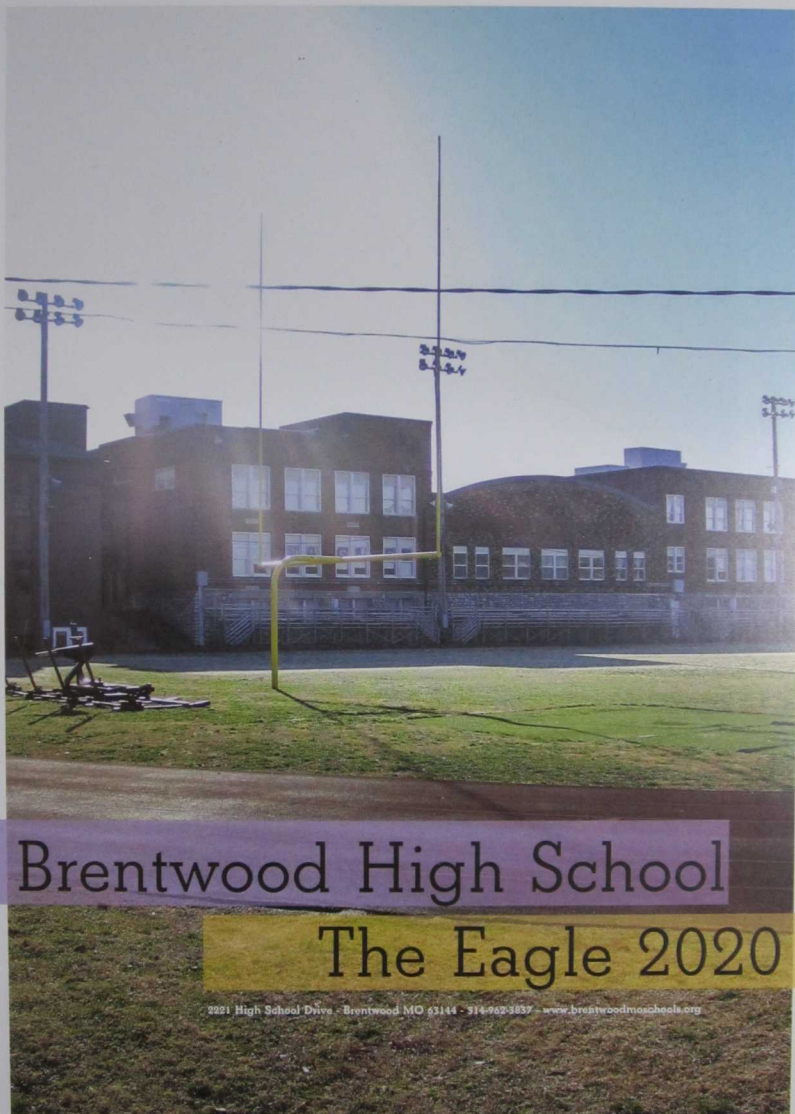

Brentwood High School was established in 1927 and has been prospering ever since. The last major construction on the school was the library, science labs, and other classrooms in 1969. Brentwood officially passed Proposition B on April 2, 2018 to be able to update the schools. A ground breaking ceremony was held on June 1st to start off construction.

Although construction is progressing, it has not been without difficulty. For example, students had to miss a day of school because of the strong fumes from the tile remover. To solve this problem, short term flooring was put down and fans were placed to help resolve the smells. "The fans have helped but it is still pretty strong. I definitely walk a little faster to get to classes now," said senior Reginald Jeffrey. Teachers have also had to move their classrooms due to construction. Although things haven't been perfect, the high school is on its way to becoming new and modern. "I think construction is progressing as expected. It is difficult to go to school in the middle of all these renovations, but we are confident it is all going to be worth



it next school year when they are complete," said Dr. Ayotte.

The first completed project was the cafeteria, which has a new deli area. At the beginning of winter, the gym was complete with brand new bleachers and a new high tech scoreboard. "It will be nice for students to be able to see an update on the remodeling," said sophomore Camille Harris. Along with the gym being completed, the new band room and the new wrestling room were also finished this year. The new STEM labs were also finished and ready for students to use during second semester. Construction has kept Brentwood High School going with the flow all year and we are excited to see what's next!

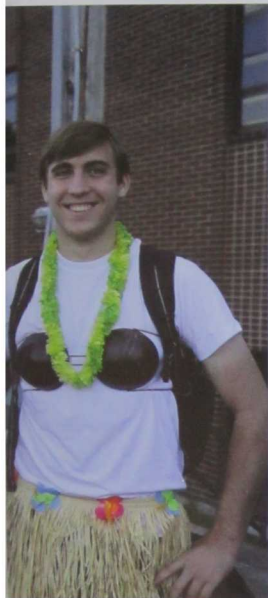

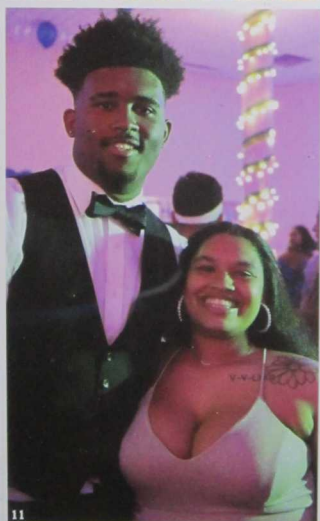

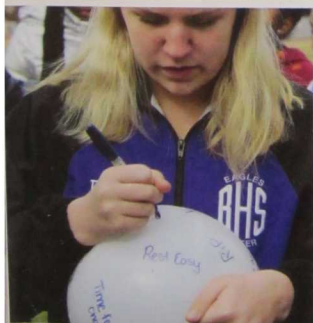


IN MEMORY OF THOSE LOST

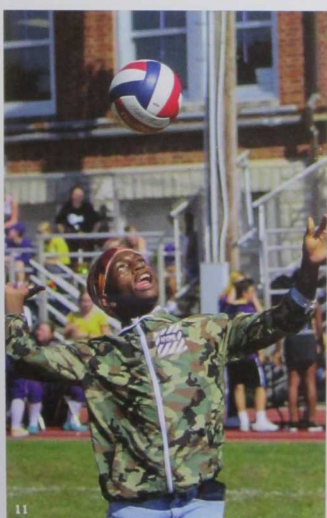
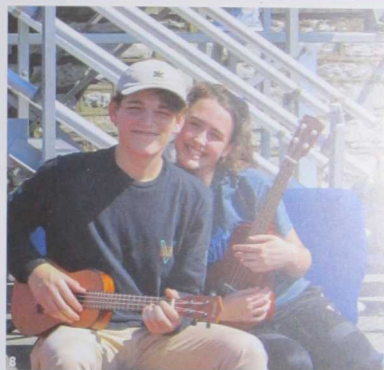

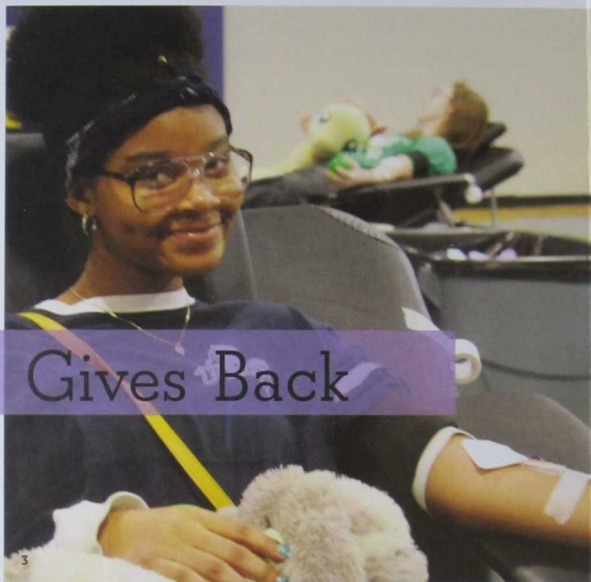

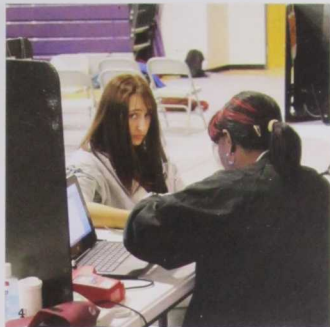

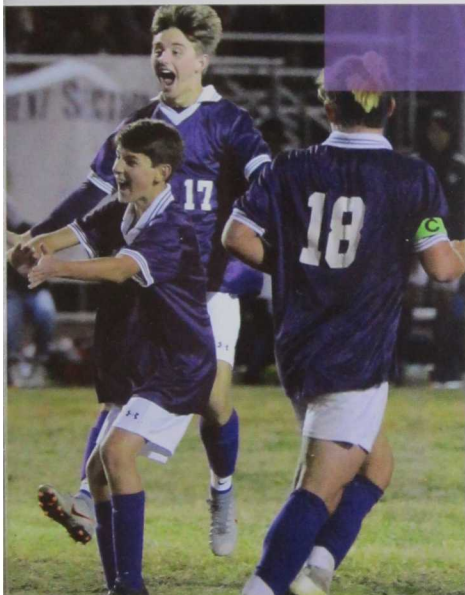

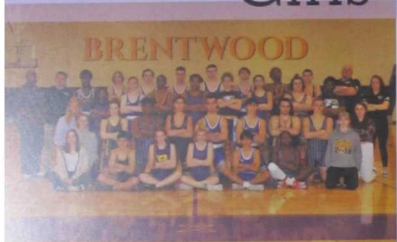

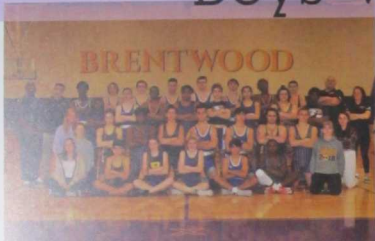

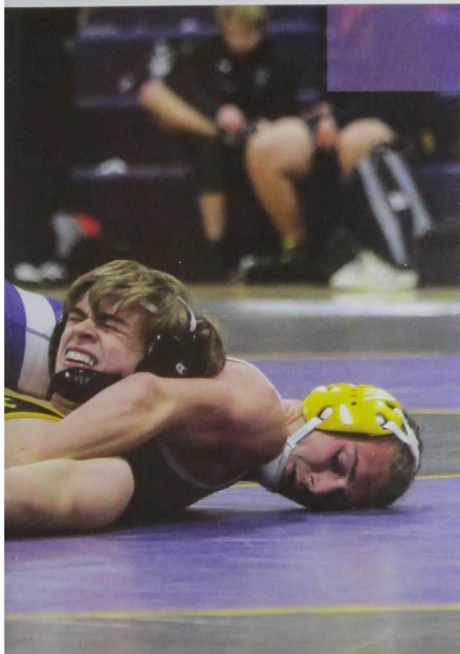

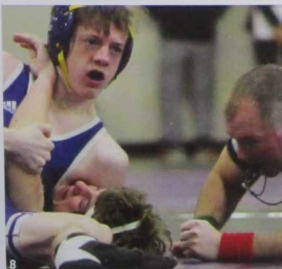

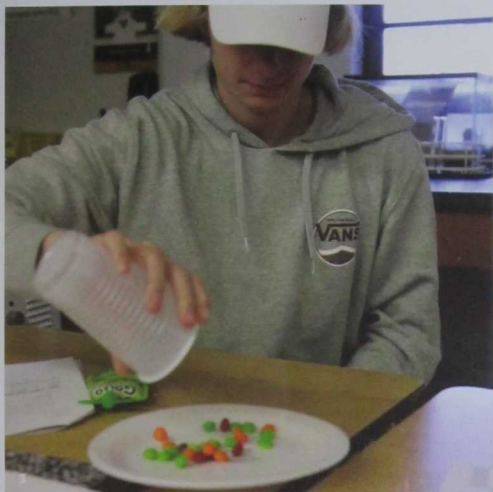

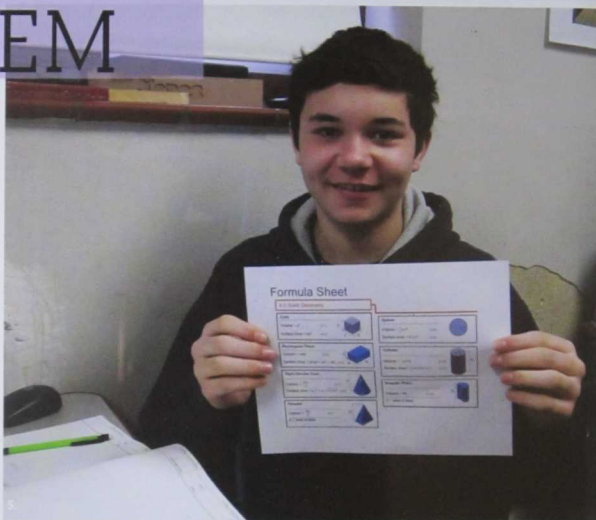

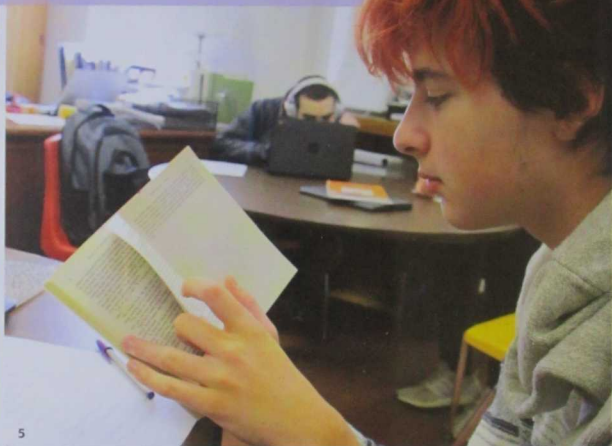

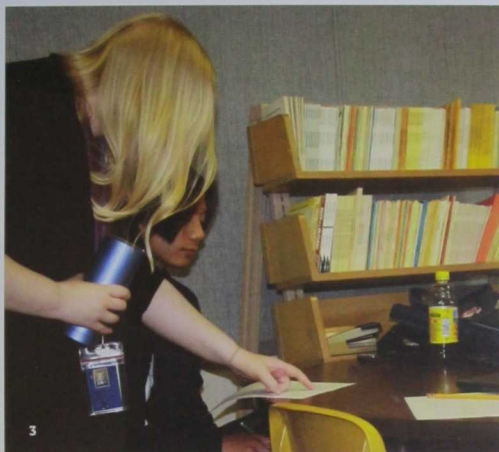

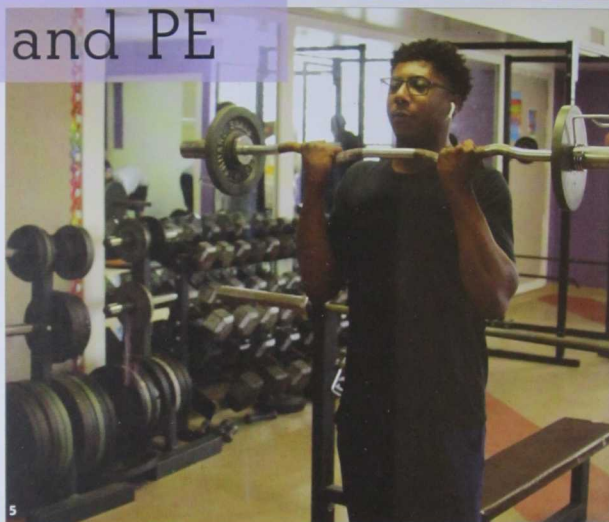

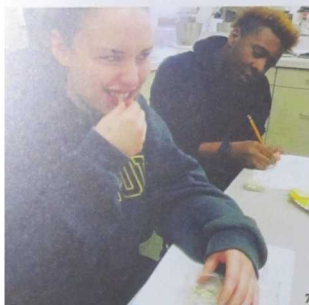

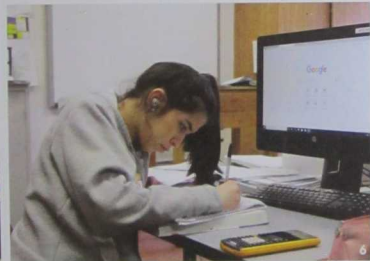

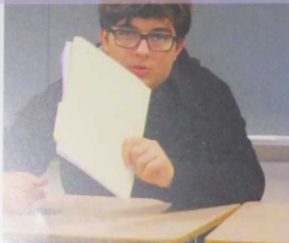

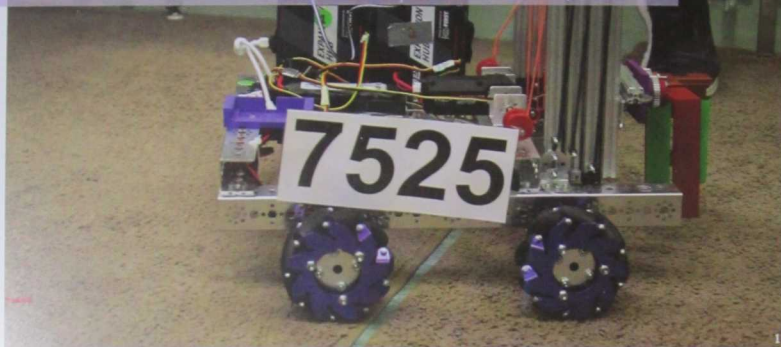

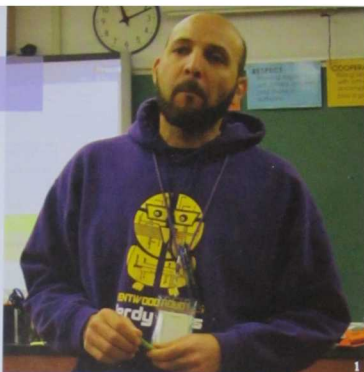

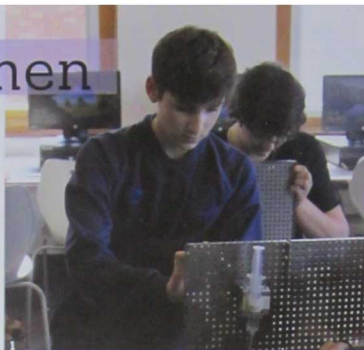

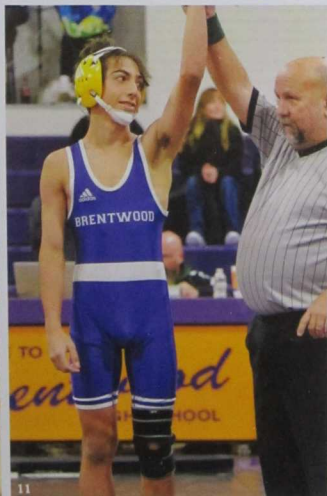

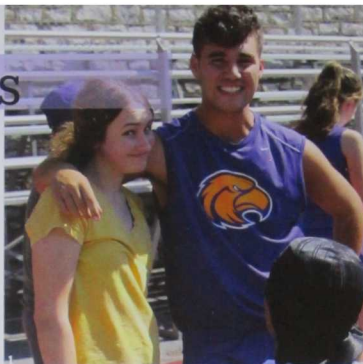

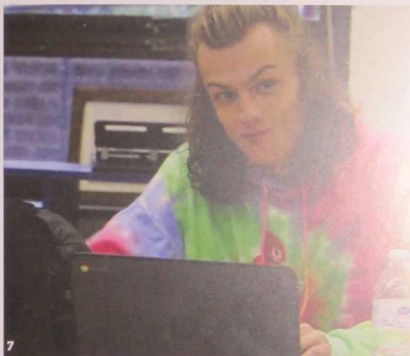

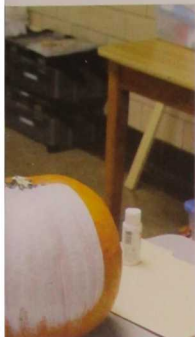

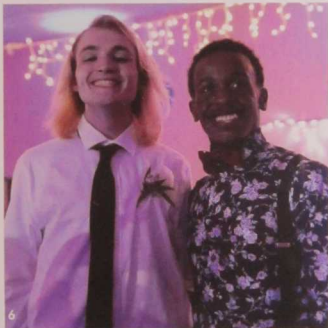

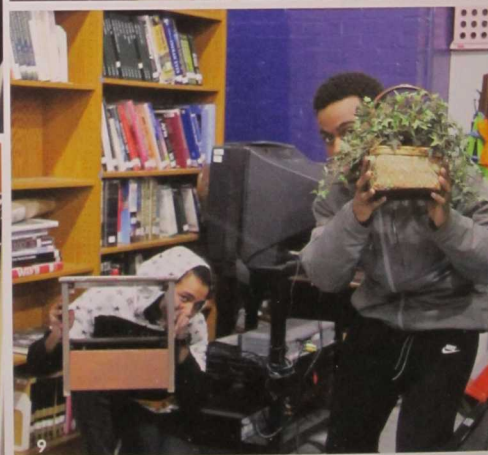

CORONAVIRUS COVID-19

Symptoms of COVID-19

(coronavirus disease 2019)



The Centers for Disease Control entered uncharted territory with the outbreak of a respiratory disease caused by a novel (new) coronavirus. First detected in China in December of 2019, COVID-19 rapidly spread worldwide, first to Korea and Japan, then to Italy and the United States; at time of print, it was in more than 123 countries and was responsible for more than 5,000 deaths. By March of 2020, multiple states, including California declared a state of emergency; on March 10th, universities around the States began to shut down and moved exclusively to online learning in an effort to keep people from congregating in close quarters. The stock market plummeted in response to the virus, and many businesses - particularly in the industries of tourism and air travel - faced devastating losses of demand for their services. Within the United States, people responded to the increase in confirmed cases by rushing to stores to stock up on hand sanitizer, soap, disinfecting wipes, protective face masks, and even toilet paper. Store shelves were empty of products within hours of opening their doors. The situation evolved on a day-to-day, hour-by-hour basis. New travel restrictions were implemented by the US administration and On March 11, the World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a pandemic. On March 13, President Trump announced a national state of emergency. On March 16, schools across Oklahoma began to close, some indefinitely, as buildings needed to be cleaned and large crowds were discouraged from gathering.

The National Basketball League announced at 9:31 p.m. ET on March 11 that all games, including those scheduled for that night, were canceled until further notice while the league determined its next steps. This move was made as a result of Utah Jazz center Rudy Gobert testing positive for COVID-19. On Thursday, Jazz guard Donovan Mitchell confirmed on Instagram that he, too, had tested positive. Five NBA teams who had played the Jazz were ordered to self-quarantine: the Detroit Pistons, Boston Celtics, Cleveland Cavaliers, New York Knicks and the Toronto Raptors.



Following the NBA's action, the National Hockey League also suspended their season on March 11. With 189 games and three and a half weeks remaining in the NHL's regular season, the league hopes to resume once the virus peaks. Major League Baseball announced at the same time that all remaining Spring Training games were canceled and the 2020 season would be delayed for at least 2 weeks. Major League Soccer and the PCA followed suit by canceling their respective events.
